1	I have read through the narrative writing task carefully and identified that I have been asked to detail a scientific process, write a historical account of important figures/events, or write a story.	
2	I have completed the narrative writing task source organizer detailing the scientific process, historical accounts of events, or story.	
3	The beginning of my essay established the situation and place, hinting at the theme/big picture of the scientific process, historical account, or story (revealing conflicts, issues, different points of view).	
4	I utilized transitional phrases and clauses (additionally, furthermore, consequently, nevertheless, etc.), and implemented a minimum of three figurative language devices (metaphor, imagery, personification) into my story.	
5	I have developed characters across scenes, offering insight into their troubles, hopes, relationships, and giving clues about how they change.	
6	I have followed the four-paragraph format for my story, historical account, or scientific process. My essay is clearly and sequentially organized with an introduction, body and conclusion.	
7	I have reviewed the grammar in my story, historical account, or scientific process and corrected mistakes to ensure that it does not become a distraction to the reader.	
8	I have developed a sense of closure by revealing character change(s) that followed from events in the story or resolution. My conclusion is related to the story, historical account, or scientific process.
